



We have more than 300 fulltime staff who focus on service, integrity and excellence.

We support UNT's main Denton campus, Discovery Park, UNT Frisco, Woodhill Square, the Kristin Farmer Autism Center and three other off-campus locations.

UNT's campus has 2.5M square feet of educational and general use space, and all maintenance is overseen by our department.

Each fiscal year, on average, our team completely closes out 96 percent or more of our service work orders.

The 4 percent not closed out within one fiscal year are typically more complex, requiring input and assistance from several staffing areas.

That is an average of more than 3,000 work orders closed out each month by our various teams!

Building Renovation by Age Category





Some recent successes

- Created a new workflow to more effectively reconcile and close construction projects.
- There is now a 3.7 day average turnaround for construction contract invoice processing.
- Assisted UNT System, UNT Dallas and UNT HSC with training and implementation of their new space and facilities maintenance modules. UNT has used FMW: Workplace for several years.
- In 2023, our teams spent 884 hours working after hours and on weekends to support UNT events, such as residents' move-in and commencement.
- Mapped more than 11,000 GPS points at Frisco Landing, which opened in 2023. This means we can be assured of all utility locations and specs, real estate boundaries, and other data that will help with future expansion.
- Created the Unit Level Master Planning committee to better collaborate with academic and administrative areas on their future needs
- Creating a new, interactive campus map, which will be ready for use by fall 2024.

UNT Police Department

Some recent successes

- Sgt. Cody Howell was accepted into Homeland Security's prestigious Master Trainer Threat Assessment Instructor program. He and Cpl. Chris Beadle will lead threat assessment efforts in the future to secure the safety of our UNT community.
- Installed 17 license-plate reader cameras at various campus locations. Recently, these helped us identify and capture people involved in a multi-state catalytic converter theft ring.
- Hired a police officer to join the corporal and sergeant on our Community Engagement team and created a new logo for that team. They lead our efforts to connect with the UNT community and conduct a minimum of 12 free safety classes each semester for students, faculty, and staff.
- In 2023, we hired six new officers. All new recruits spend about 10 months in various stages of training before they patrol solo. Mental health, de-escalation, and other topics are part of our ongoing police training.

Our department has held dual accreditation continuously since 2006. To maintain these, we adhere to 688 best practices for modern policing.

In 2023, we held or participated in 197 community events that reached about 9,000 UNT students, faculty and staff.

We also gave out about 400 U-locks to help students protect their bicycles. Funding for locks provided by the We Mean Green Fund.

Forty percent of our police and non-sworn staff members are UNT alumni. Even more of our staff have at least one dependent here at UNT. We enjoy serving UNT because we are part of this community.

Some recent successes

- In early 2024, an MOU was drafted for our Emergency Management & Safety Services staff to direct emergency management and continuity planning for each UNT entity.
- Insurance & Claims administered and renewed insurance for all campuses – and is forecasting \$8.4M in FY25 premiums.
- Replaced 80 AEDs in 2023 to upgrade to newer models.
 Also, added Narcan to AEDs on campus as a proactive safety measure. UNT has 140+ AEDs.
- During revision of the UNT international travel processes we signed a new insurance plan that gives better coverage and is available 24/7.
- Provided structure & help with youth programming – and consulted on 30 new programs in 2023.
- Created the new Eagle Safe Recognitions to honor those at UNT who make exceptional contributions to lab safety.
 Eight recipients were honored in fall 2023.

Parking; Transit; Staff and Student Support Services; Mobile Bike Shop

We provide parking services, and partner with the Denton County Transportation Authority to offer 24/7 transit operations for the UNT community.

New parking lot



New for UNT's 2024-25 academic year, we worked with Facilities to create Lot 59 on the land formerly occupied by Oak Street Hall. This gives us 170 additional parking spaces and electric car chargers for students.

Transportation Services

Some recent successes

- Created a new program in collaboration with Human Resources all new hires receive a temporary 2-week parking permit. This gives them time to purchase their parking permit without adding stress to their first days at UNT.
- Created two new events to assist those with citations.
 In fall, Toys for Tickets raised \$7,200 in citation adjustments and hundreds of toys for children in need. In spring, Food for Fines helped students end the year without citations and we collected nearly 4,000 UNT food pantry donations.
- Created a new citations appeals process to further improve fairness and consistency.
- Provided wayfinding help and parking assistance to more than 135,000 visitors at UNT events, including move-in and commencement.
- We are constantly improving our communications and outreach. In FY23, we created an Instagram account to help with outreach to UNT students. This complements our social media accounts on Facebook (mainly parents) and X (mainly older students).

Mobile Bike Shop helps students



Conceived by our staff, the Mobile Bike Shop was funded in FY22 by a grant from the We Mean Green Fund. The shop sells bicycle-related products, at wholesale prices and our staff members do minor bicycle repairs. On average, we take it around campus about 50 days each year.

In FY23 we had 2,390 visitors and fixed 648 bicycles.

Challenge Coins


We honor those who go above and beyond with one of five coins: teamwork, professional development, humanity, ideation and service.

Recruiting New Officers

The UNT Police Department's Public Safety Officer program has grown from 5 to more than 20. These are students serving students by providing a safe environment. It's also a great place to recruit new officers. We currently have one going through the academy.

Class Participation

In fall 2023, Risk Management leadership served as advisors and judges on student projects. VP Gibson also spends time with accounting students, and we have a guest speaker guide for our many staff who are also alumni and want to give back to UNT by speaking to classes.

Food Pantry Sponsor

Each spring semester, we host a massive food drive to support UNT's student food pantry. In spring 2024, we donated 4,873 items - up 10% from spring 2023.

Each month, Risk Management Services cleans up a spot in Lot 20. Several of our departments have participated in UNT's Adopt-A-Block program.
